





# Y2 Living Things and Habitats KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER




## ESSENTIAL LIVING THINGS AND HABITATS VOCABULARY

<b>Life processes</b>	They are the things that all living things do. They move breathe, sense, grow, make babies, get rid of waste and get their energy from food.
<b>living</b>	Things that are living have all the life process.
<b>dead</b>	Things that are dead were once living.
<b>Never living</b>	Things made out of metal, plastic or rock were never living. They never had the life processes.
<b>Food chain</b>	A food chain shows how each animal gets its food. Food chains are one of the ways that living things depend on each other to stay alive.
<b>Food sources</b>	This is the place a living thing's food comes from.
<b>microhabitat</b>	A microhabitat is a very small habitat in places like under a rock, under leaves or on a branch. Minibeasts live in micro habitats. The microhabitats have everything they need to survive.
<b>depend</b>	Many living things in a habitat depend on each other. This means they need each other for different things.
<b>survive</b>	This means to stay alive
<b>habitat</b>	A habitat is the natural place that something lives in. A habitat provides living things with everything they need to survive such as food shelter and water.
<b>carnivore</b>	An animal that gets their food from eating other animals.
<b>herbivore</b>	Animals that get their food from eating plants
<b>omnivore</b>	Some animals get their food from eating some plants and some other animals.

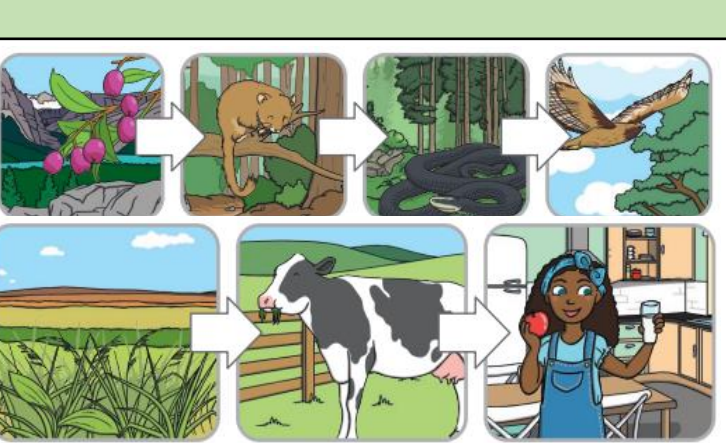
